Dear TMPC Family,

We are quickly entering the Christmas season when our diaries fill up with family, work and church events. It's a wonderful season that gives us opportunity to be a bit more public with different aspects of the gospel. I hope you are able to attend and support some aspect of these cultural events that have originated from biblical truths. No doubt some of these events have morphed away from the biblical meaning but we can still enjoy those aspects that reflect the truths of the bible and get the message out into the public square.

At the same time, our lives are extremely full from work, family, church, social circles, clubs, sports, and our ever present availability to those accessing us through modern technology. I'll call these our 'horizontal' relationships and commitments. These are all important and necessary but unless we are seeing, doing and experiencing these things *coram deo*, (in the presence of God, 'vertically'), we will become worn out and exhausted no matter how much we enjoy them.

We were not designed to consume and be consumed by all these various horizontal relationships and commitments. God is present in our lives all the time, we need to be more aware of his presence. We need to enjoy him even as we experience the horizontal relationships he has given us.

One way to do this, even at this busy time of year, is to find a particular passage of the bible that has impacted you, is impacting you or which you would like to look into a little more. Then slow down and look more closely at it. Give yourself some time and place to read, think, meditate, mull over, chew on and see what God might teach you through this passage. What does it say about God? What is this passage about in its context? What does it say about redemption? What does it say about our or my need in relation to God?

Spend some time with the passage asking God to teach and encourage you in your relationship with him. Ask the Holy Spirit to open the eyes of your understanding that you might see the wonders of God more clearly and enjoy him more fully.

I hope you have a Merry Christmas season.

NEWS FROM HENGYANG, CHINA. (I.C.C.)

Hello everyone,

We have enjoyed a week of much milder weather, cool with very high humidity, which makes it difficult to dry our washing indoors!!!! It is a very Chinese thing to mop the floors often, and in this kind of weather, the floors stay wet for a long time.

As mentioned in the last newsletter, Dennis travelled to Shenzhen to meet up with a Hong Kong based team member and he brought back a very large suitcase packed with sleep posture equipment.

On the very next morning, 2 of the local therapists from our welfare centre held a pre-work training session for about 30 carers and other therapists, all of whom are caring daily for the children who will benefit from the new sleeping equipment. All of our therapists had been trained earlier over 3 days by a Singapore based physiotherapist, who has expertise in sleep therapy systems.

Dennis and I joined in the training sessions, as we have a vested interest, knowing that some of the equipment has been purchased by TMPC and my mum. There was much excitement as they got the carers to lie down and actually try out



the padded mattresses, various padded apparatus, pillows, pieces of foam, while others placed the equipment according to the posture requirements of the children in their constant care. (See photo)

We have also been privileged to watch various young girls and boys being settled into their unique sleep setups in their bedrooms, prior to their after lunch sleep time. It has been a joy to watch the carers persevere with the placing of the equipment for each child. (See **Photo**) They understand that any improvement in the child's wellbeing may take a year or more, but that these acts of love only improve quality of life.

Several of us will be in Hong Kong later this week, so Dennis, Alison and I will each be bringing a large suitcase filled with more sleep

posture equipment back to Hengyang next Sunday.

The children (our reason for being here) are delightful. There is always so much happening and we feel privileged. We both realize that without language, we are so often hamstrung, but we get by. I pick up on repetitive phrases that the children say, especially "haiyou" which means let's do it more, more and more because it's fun!

We always seem to provide some intrigue to the locals, who know that any foreigners must be associated with the welfare centre, as you don't see tourists here. Almost everything we do is on foot, and when the weather is fine, there are always groups of mostly elderly men and women sitting around on the sides of the street or below the building where they live, just watching the world go by and chatting. They nod and smile at us and we wave and say hello.

We live next to a cable factory, where hundreds of workers stream in and out over 24 hours. There is plenty of street food and there are makeshift noodle shops outside the factory gates for all the workers.

On the other side of us is a large middle school, so hundreds of high school children attend. As described in previous years, the morning music starts (LOUDLY) at 6 am, so we never need an alarm clock!

So, again, Thank you for loving us and remembering us from afar, and I hope that these little snippets of life here are interesting for you. With love, Lynne and Dennis.

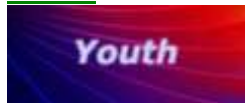
Music and Media groups, Greeting, Offering and Morning Tea.
