Dear TMPC Family,

There is a lot of ministry happening in our church. That is, people who are serving God and serving one another in some way(s) so that the people of God will be encouraged and built up in Christ. In order for this to happen effectively there are a number of things that need to be in place.

Most importantly, effective ministry is gospel ministry. In fact, if serving God and serving one another does not work out of, or toward, the gospel then we can question whether or not it is ministry the church should be engaged in. This is not as easily determined as it might sound because it takes into consideration the motives and intents of our hearts as well as the external things we are doing. However, we need to keep reminding ourselves that we are engaged in the ministry of the gospel.

Whether we are speaking or doing (1 Peter 4:10-11), it is so that **'God may be praised through Jesus Christ'**. **'And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and deeds.'** (Hebrews 10:24) This verse draws our attention to the need to think about how we can encourage each other in gospel ministry. Slow down, (or stop if necessary) and take stock of how you are serving Christ. Do you know him? Do you understand his gospel of salvation? Could you explain it in its simplicity to someone asking you? Are you growing in your faith? These are just a couple of questions you can run through your heart and mind. The way you answer them can help to keep you on track in your serving Christ.

Another practical aspect of serving Christ is our willingness to defer to one another when we need to. I may be **'on a mission'** to do something for Christ. But if I leave behind me several **'used'** and **'discarded'** people then the way I do **'my mission'** may be questionable. Remember the chapter on love? If you **'speak and do'** with great faith, but with no love, you gain nothing. (1Corinthians 13:1-3)

As we serve Christ the church **'grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.'** (Ephesians 4:16)

Changing the subject a little, I wanted to pick up on the place of elders in the Presbyterian Church. The **'office and function'** of elders is found in the Old Testament and more fully developed in the New Testament. (see 1 Timothy 3, 5; Titus 1; 1 Peter 5:1-4)

In the Presbyterian Church of Queensland potential elders are trained and vetted as to their suitability by **the Session and elected by the congregation. There is no hierarchy of 'top down' authority in the Presbyterian church.** The authority comes from looking wider to other Presbyterian churches. A Presbytery is made up of a number of churches in a defined geographical area. TMPC is in Mowbray Presbytery which has about 30 churches in it. We meet monthly. Each church sends a pastor and an Elder. That Elder is chosen each year by the Session to represent his congregation (along with the pastor) at presbytery. The P.C. Queensland has a codebook which describes the responsibilities of the elders which include: **'It is his duty to cultivate relationships with and exercise pastoral care for the Communicants and Adherents in his pastoral responsibility, by visiting them, especially in affliction, and assisting them by friendly counsel as opportunity arises.'**

Please pray for our elders and their ministry in the church.

Celebrating Our Heritage:

The Doctrines of 'Faith Alone' and 'Grace Alone' in the Protestant Reformation

We have spent the last several articles discussing the principle doctrine upon which the other rediscoveries of the Protestant Reformation rest, namely Sola Scriptura: that the Christian scriptures contain the only final authority for Christian doctrine--that they contain all that is necessary for salvation and this salvation is communicated clearly enough for the ordinary believer to understand. In this context, Christian tradition is neither rejected or elevated, but functions as a subordinate authority for theological formulation.

Now, I am going to move to discuss two of the remaining five 'Solus' of the Reformation, namely: Sola Fide and Sola Gratia. In summary, as we have discussed, Sola Fide [i.e., 'by faith alone']: is the doctrinal claim that Christ's righteousness, sufficient for complete salvation, is imputed completely through the instrument of faith, which is itself a gift from God. This means that neither individual works of Christian obedience (e.g., prayers, tithes, charity, etc) nor 'faith plus these works' are the basis for receiving salvation. Instead, it is only through faith that we receive all of the benefits of salvation because of the integrity of the Object of our faith--Christ--and not even because of the amount or quality of our faith.

Please allow me to clarify several points.

- First, notice that the discussion of 'faith alone' begins with the sufficiency of Christ for salvation. In other words, the focus is not even on faith itself, but upon the object of faith, which is Christ. This means that the quality or substance of one's faith is less important than that in which one's faith is placed. Each of us, from time to time, struggles in faith--with doubts, distractions, and trials. But even still, Christ remains sufficient to save, despite the weakness of our faith. See Jn. 6:29; cf., Gal. 2:16. This emphasis--on the sufficiency of Christ as the Object of faith, rather than even specifically on faith, as if its own quality or substance--is why Luther and other Protestants spoke of the faith as an 'instrument,' or tool by which one receives salvation. Indeed, for Calvin, faith as the basis for 'union with Christ' was the principal venue by which all of the saving benefits of Christ are conferred on believers. Note, for example, whenever you see the phrase 'in Christ,' (hundreds of times in the New Testament) that you should think of 'faith as the means by which believers receive Christ's benefits.

PERSECUTED CHRISTIANS

PAKISTAN

There are only 3.8 million Christians in Pakistan out of a total population of 192.8 million and the Christians feel increasingly under threat in their daily lives.

Blasphemy Law

The Pakistani government has launched an international effort to not allow material on social media that they consider blasphemous to Islam. Back in March it was announced that 22 Muslim governments would collaborate on a strategy paper to be put before the UN to oppose “the madness unleashed against Islam and its holy personalities in the name of freedom of expression.

In May millions of Pakistanis received text messages on their mobile phones warning them that sharing “blasphemous content” online is punishable under the law and asking them to report any such content.

Aasia Bibi has now been in prison for over 8 years. She was falsely accused of blasphemy by her Muslim co-workers after a quarrel during which they rebuked her for drinking water from the same cup that Muslims used and she is reported as saying “*I believe in Jesus Christ, who died on the cross for the sins of mankind. What did your Prophet Muhammad ever do to save mankind?*”

Her case has now reached the Supreme Court, but the scheduled hearings keep being postponed.

Kidnappings

On 22 August 2017 police found Sameera, a 16 year old Christian girl who was kidnapped on 13 July 2017. She had been raped, forcibly married to her captors and forced to convert to Islam. A 2014 report by a Pakistani NGO estimated that each year at least 700 Christian girls and young women and 300 Hindu girls and young women suffer similar abuse. Many abductors escape justice because the girls are not able to testify freely in Court.

Attacks on Churches

Many churches have been attacked but praise God that Pakistani security services foiled a planned terrorist attack on a church in Lahore at Easter. There had been a huge and deadly attack on Christians in Lahore on Easter Sunday 2016 when more than 70 people were killed and many more injured.

Ramadan

On 11.5.17 the Standing Committee on Religious Affairs of Pakistan’s Senate unanimously approved a bill to enforced the Islamic Ramadan fast month. Anybody, whether Muslim or non-Muslim, who eats openly during the daytime will be liable to a fine of \$6.40 and a 3 month prison sentence. Hotel owners would be fined \$310 and cinemas \$6,360.

Pray for:-

- real change in Pakistan so that all minorities are safe from malicious false accusation.
- justice and freedom for Aasia Bibi and others like her who have been imprisoned.
- freedom and healing for the girls who have been kidnapped.
- protection for God’s people.
- the law relating to Ramadan to be repealed before the next Ramadan in May 2018.



Highlighting TMPC → Lynne Brown Kenyon has given us a beautiful insight as to what happens at our Church's Playtime Group, thanks Lynne.

→ PLAYTIME GROUP QUESTIONS (Lynne Brown-Kenyon)

Who leads Playtime? Playtime is co-led by Lynne Brown-Kenyon and Sue Nelson.

Who helps? Our kitchen helpers are Lyn Furness, Val Dunlea and Jennifer Kerruish. We also have a very able, energetic and helpful mum, Naomi, mother of 2 boys who are now both at school. Naomi is a Christian, and continues to come to Playtime and contributes much.

What roles are there?

Our kitchen ladies work out their roster between themselves, so there is usually at least one of them in attendance, and sometimes two. They welcome parents and receive fruit and morning tea goodies, prepare the fruit and drinks for the children, then serve tea, coffee and cakes to the adults. It is a lovely informal way for them to befriend and encourage while serving up morning tea to grateful children and adults alike. The kitchen helpers also do a great job in clearing up, washing up and finishing up in the kitchen.

Sue's and my roles in leadership are many, but our individual gifts probably come to the fore, and this works well.

Newcomers to Playgroup are welcomed by both Sue and I. After our initial introductions, we try to introduce the new mother to another mother with a child of similar age or to someone who is friendly and welcoming.

I (Lynne) oversee the setup each day and keep the weekly parent roster happening, making sure that there are activities set up and toys to play with. Whilst trying to keep conversations happening with parents, I also gravitate to the children and keep a watchful eye over all, especially in regards to safety, their interactions etc, whilst keeping the programme running.

Sue has a wonderful ability to get alongside parents, grandparents or carers on the periphery....those who are lonely and maybe not fitting in so well, those who are feeling sad on the day or have family issues. Sue is able to spend time and chat, counsel or just listen.

Sue's and my roles in Playtime extend through the week. Individually, we babysit when necessary; regularly cook meals for families with newborns or for those undergoing stress; help in many practical ways as well as being available for counsel and coffee chats.

For several years, Christine Hall has hand made thoughtful gifts for Mothers Day, Easter and Christmas, with a gentle Christian message, and these have always been received well and much appreciated.

When do you meet? We meet on Tuesdays (through the school term) from 9:15 to 11:30.

Where do you meet? We meet in the church hall, and try to have one Playtime per term at Staffsmitth Park.

What is the aim of Playtime? Playtime has changed considerably since it began in about 2001 under the leadership of Anna Marsh and Karen Partridge. Whilst it began as an outreach, it mainly catered for the many church families with young children. Down through the years under the leadership of Jen Nichol, Charissa Quinn and Jo Jenner, Playtime continued successfully. We now run Playtime as an outreach to the community, desiring to share Jesus one-on-one through conversations and modelling His love through serving and lots of love, compassion, listening and nurture.

Who attends? Mums, dads, aunties, grandmas, grandads, au pairs and lots of children from newborns to pre-prep age. Our families come from Tamborine Mountain, Tamborine Village, Canungra, Jimboomba, Gold Coast and extending towards Beenleigh. We no longer have any young families from our church.

They initially hear about Playtime from the local childcare nurse, the Bargain centre or word of mouth from other parents and come along on Tuesdays.

Is your group consistent or lots of clientele change? There is a core of families who have attended Playtime for several years with each of their children. We also have a considerable number who attend fairly regularly, along with a **considerable number who attend irregularly. We understand that families' attendances are governed by sickness and family circumstances. Some new attendees quickly assimilate into the Playtime situation whilst others find the "busyness" a little overwhelming.** It is not unusual for families to return to Playtime after an absence of a year or more. What is enjoyable?

- * Knowing that the Holy Spirit enables us in this ministry.
- * The privilege of meeting families and speaking into their lives.
- * Watching babies grow into little people and sharing the joys and struggles of these early years with parents.

What is hard to do?

- *Maintaining our energy levels in what is a physically demanding ministry.
- *Maintaining consistent relationships with folk who attend irregularly.
- ***Building deeper relationships with a majority who show little interest in the Bible, Christian celebrations, childrens' stories and songs about Jesus.**
- ***Trusting God for wisdom, tenderness and compassion as we've dealt with tragedies (a child's drowning 2 years ago; a young mum's sudden passing this year) and deep grieving within our Playtime family.**

Do you have needs that the congregation can help you meet? Is there a way for the congregation to engage better with Playtime if needed?

There are several aspects of TMPC membership that are important to keep in mind:

1. Membership is based on a profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Saviour. *(see questions below)
2. Membership is a mutual agreement between the individual and church; that the individual will make every effort to attend worship regularly, support the church through active participation and willingly submit himself/herself to the biblical/spiritual oversight of the pastor and elders. The pastor and elders are committed to overseeing and nurturing the spiritual life of the members of the church.
3. **TMPC is a 'confessional' church which means that it is related to other Presbyterian churches by a 'confession', (the Westminster Confession of Faith). The Pastor and elders vow to uphold the WCF as our church's confession. Members who join the church are encouraged to be familiar with its teachings. (Copies available on internet or call me).**
4. Members have the right to vote in both temporal and spiritual matters of the congregation.
5. Those who want to retain membership in another Christian Church or who cannot in good conscience join the Presbyterian Church, yet who want to worship at TMPC regularly and make it their church home, can apply to the Session for Adherent membership.
6. Those who are current members in a Presbyterian Church can have their membership transferred by requesting the Session of TMPC in writing.


